MISSION STATEMENTS OF ST. BARTHOLOMEW PARISH MINISTRIES/ORGANIZATIONS

Parish Pastoral Council

Parish Pastoral Councils (PPCs) grew out of Vatican II. In 1989, it became the policy of the Archdiocese of Chicago that every parish in the Archdiocese have a Parish Pastoral Council. The four basic responsibilities of the Council are to research the needs, the ideas and the hopes of the faith community; to encourage and support existing ministries; to evaluate the quality of life in the parish faith community; to plan for the parish's future by recommending policies, procedures, and programs that will implement its values and fulfill the Church's mission.

At St. Bartholomew, the PPC also coordinates Hospitality Sundays, hosted by different groups/ministries throughout the year.

Spiritual Life Commission

Art & Environment

The Art and Environment ministry designs and implements the seasonal decorations, banners, altar cloths, and anything necessary to enhance the aesthetic environment of the church throughout the liturgical year. Ministers care for the environmental setting throughout the church building.

Altar Servers

Altar servers assist the celebrant and worshiping community in the celebration of the Liturgy of the Mass, special Liturgies and celebrations, and the celebration of the sacraments. We are blessed to have an intricate role in the Mass, performing specific actions and setting an example to the congregation by our active participation in the Liturgy. It is our hope that the tasks we perform will help out worship to draw all of us to participate in an intimate way during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and to desire unity with Jesus Christ.

Eucharistic Ministers

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion is the formal title of laypeople who distribute the Eucharist during Mass. This training provides all those wishing to serve in this ministry sufficient spiritual, theological and practical preparation to fulfill their role with knowledge and reverence. All ministers of Holy Communion should show the greatest reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist by their demeanor, their attire, and the manner in which they handle the consecrated bread or wine. This training is open to adults and teens who have received their confirmation.

Guadalupanos #39 Committee

The objective of Saint Bartholomew Guadalupanos #39 Committee is to promote the Doctrine of the Catholic Church through the devotion and intercession of our Blessed Mother, Santa María de Guadalupe. Also, and as much as possible, to work, serve, and support ideas, and programs of our parish and community. Meetings are held as needed based on the subject matter, particularly for and prior to

our fund-raising activities leading to a better annual celebration of our Lady of Guadalupe #39 on December 12th.

Catholic Education Commission

St. Bartholomew School

St. Bartholomew School is a Catholic elementary school dedicated to the education and formation of students in Grades Pre-Kindergarten to Eighth Grade. St. Bartholomew School is a valued ministry of St. Bartholomew Parish. The school – in collaboration with parents as primary educators and the parish community as faith witnesses – endeavors to create an educational atmosphere which models the Christ-centered way of learning and living. Saint Bartholomew School strives to develop the unique potential of its students in a culturally diverse setting and to prepare its students with the knowledge, values, attitudes, skills required for active participation in the contemporary world.

Athletic Department

The St. Bartholomew Athletic Program consists of both Interscholastic and Intramural levels of competition. Instruction, practice, teamwork and good sportsmanship are important elements of our program. Grades 5 - 8 participate in the Northwest Catholic Conference (NWCC) and the Northwest Parish League (NWPL). The 4th grade girls and boys basketball teams participate in the Big-10 League.

Extended Day Program

As an option and a service for the parent working outside the home, this program is available on full days of school; also from 11:30 AM until 6:30 PM on half-days of school. Participation in the program is restricted to students attending Saint Bartholomew School. EDP provides a variety of after-school activities including recreation, snacks, arts/crafts projects, board games, computer programs, homework time, and rest.

Parents' Club

The Mission of the Parents' Club is to enhance and support the educational experience at St. Bartholomew School . We work to develop a closer connection between school and home by encouraging parent involvement and to improve the environment at St. Bartholomew through volunteer and financial support.

School Board

The mission of the St. Bartholomew School Board is to advise the pastor and principal on business matters of the school. We support and promote a Catholic education through our involvement in school, parish, and community.

Parish Life Commission

Catholic Women's Guild

The CWG's mission is to unite all women in religious, educational, and social activities, and to assist the Pastor in spiritual and material undertakings for the welfare of the parish.

Girl Scouts

Girl Scouting builds girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place.

- We have a strong core of life-long and long tenured parish families.
- There are many willing volunteers at St. Bart's...a Pastor just has to reach out and ask.
- Our school, our choir and our active parishioners.
- The people are friendly and concerned.
- St. Bart's has a **strong foundation based on respect and value**. This is shown through the events and services that are provided through the parish and the school.
- Our strength is the people who make our parish a **family**.

Weaknesses

- We need to bridge the gap between Church/Parish life and School.
- We need to continue to work on our finances and debt.
- We need to find a **tenant for Convent**. Addison School building is also underutilized. However, we use Krueger Hall (basement of Addison Building) for many functions.
